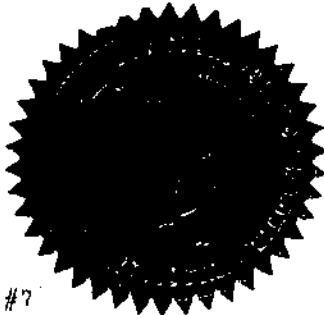
} Decree of Divorce.

Now at this day this cause coming on for hearing; comes the plaintiff in his own proper person, and by attorney, and the defendant although being in default as to the pleadings, appears by her attorney. Thereupon plaintiff submits this cause to the Court, upon the pleading and proof, and the Court, after hearing the evidence herein, being satisfied that the plaintiff is an innocent and injured party, and entitled to the relief prayed for in his amended petition, doth order, adjudge and decree that he absolutely and forever divorced from the bonds of matrimony existing between him and said defendant, and that he be restored to all the rights and privileges of an unmarried person; and that he have the care, custody and control of the minor child of said parties referred to in the petition, until the further order of the Court, and that the defendant he and she is hereby permitted to visit and see said child, one time each month, at the home of the plaintiff. It is further ordered

and that the plaintiff pay the costs of this proceeding, and that execution issue therefor.
